Context

 2017: launched internal project "Streamlining and simplification of fisheries statistics". Reasons: several data flows and statistical regulations, CFP reform 2014

• 2018-2019: 1st step \rightarrow Evaluation of fisheries statistics

• 2020 (ongoing): 2^{nd} step \rightarrow Impact assessment



Evaluation of fisheries statistics (I)

Evaluation results

Extensive evidence data collection

Staff Working Document SWD(2019) 425

• EFS are an important independent information source serving user needs related to fisheries management, market monitoring and research

 But added value on a downward trend as other sources such as Control Regulation and Data Collection Framework better targeted and covering socio-economic aspects



Evaluation of fisheries statistics (II)

• **Conclusion:** The policy, public and stakeholder contexts requires goodquality fishery statistics that are independent and fit for purpose, serve a wide range of user needs and fit well into the overall international fisheries data ecosystem.

→ Impact assessment of European Fishery Statistics to determine best option going forward
