The role of the Advisory Councils

Established by the CFP itself in order to represent all stakeholders (the industry and Other Interest Groups)

Submit recommendations on all CFP aspects to the COM and MS and might inform them of problems. They contribute to the collection and analysis of data for conservation purposes.

Their knowledge and experience is crucial for us in the context of the development and implementation of the CFP and their role was increased in with the regionalization of the CFP.

Average amount spent between 2016 and 2018 + number of members in the GA= 90%

Number of languages interpreted or translated + distance between the seat and Brussels= 10%

Framework Partnership Agreement (FPA)

Concluded as part of a long-term cooperation. The duration shall not exceed four years

To facilitate the achievement of policy objectives by establishing the contractual terms of the cooperation.

Defines the general rights and obligations of the parties in implementing their partnership



The Specific Agreement – operating grant

Concluded in the context of FPA

Only one operating grant per financial year

The grant period corresponds to the AC's accounting period



General principles applicable to grants

Equal treatment

Transparency

Co-financing

No cumulation, no double financing

Nonretroactivity

No-profit



Eligible costs



Incurred within implementation period

Indicated in the estimated budget

Incurred in connection with the action

Identifiable and verifiable

Comply with legal and fiscal requirements

Reasonable, justified sound financial management



Examples of eligible costs

The costs of personnel

Costs of travel and related subsistence allowances, provided that these costs are in line with the partner's agreed usual practices on travel

Costs of consumables and supplies

Costs arising directly from requirements imposed by the Framework agreement or the Specific agreement (dissemination of information, specific evaluation of the action, audits, translations, reproduction)

The full cost of purchase of equipment

Meeting room facilities

Interpretation and translation costs



Revenues

The own resources of the AC (i.e. membership fees in this case) should only be used to finance core activities. Membership fees therefore cannot cover ineligible costs.

Respective Member States are encouraged to provide appropriate technical, logistical and financial support to facilitate the functioning of the Advisory Councils. However, there are no specific rules on the level of the Member States contributions

Each AC shall determine the level of members' fees. The level of fees required shall be compliant with a wide representation of all stakeholders.


Limit to the maximum amount of the grant
