LEGISLATIVE DEVELOPMENTS

European Commission:

Publication of legislative proposal by DG MARE (May 2018)

European Parliament:

- Unfinished business carried over to the current parliamentary term
- Appointment of MEP Clara Aguilera (S&D, ES) as EP PECH Rapporteur (July 2019)
- New Draft Report (February 2020)
- Tabling of amendments (May 2020)
- Vote on draft report (16 November 2020 TBC)

Council:

- Negotiations ongoing
- Partial common position expected by end of the year



MACADVICE

Article 55 – Recreational Fisheries:

- Agreement with the proposal laying down rules with regarding to recreational fisheries
- Obligation to report catch is essential for greater accuracy on fish stock status
- Electronic means are recommended

Article 56 – Principles for the control of marketing:

 Support for the new draft provided it is clear that the reference to the CMO definition on "placing on the market" is clear and unambiguous

MACADVICE

Article 56a – Lots:

- Mixing species in the same lot after placing on the market should be possible, as long as the products are traceable
- Support for improved traceability for all fishing products, including highly processed products
- Concerns regarding the identification of quantities forming lots
- Concerns regarding the "threshold of 30 kg per vessel per day" derogation

Article 58 – Traceability:

- Digitalised recording Requires more precision. Importance of MS harmonisation. Costs should be eligible for EMFF reimbursement
- Traceability gaps Need for comparable traceability of imported fishery products, and a level playing field with those originating in the EU and with the EU fisheries sector
- Concern regarding the exemption for small quantities sold directly from fishing vessels to consumers

MACADVICE

Article 12 – Catch Certificate - IUU:

- Support for full digitalisation of the IUU Catch Certificate
- Transhipment Statements from third countries could be supplementary information

Small-scale fisheries:

 Support for the monitoring of position and movement of small-scale fisheries, together with the introduction of the electronic fishing logbook

• Entry into force:

Adequate time for operators and competent authorities to adapt practices and procedures
