Decision	Banning Labour	Forced	In 2021, President von der Leyen announced that further EU legislative action was needed to tackle the use of forced labour in the value chains of companies operating in the single market. The legislative initiative aims to ban the placing on the EU market of products made wholly or in part by forced labour. The ban would cover both domestic and imported products. It would be combined with risk-based enforcement framework. On 19 September 2022, COM adopted the legislative proposal. At the September 2022 meeting, the legislative proposal was presented by a COM representative. It was agreed, as an action point, that the Secretariat would consult members about their interest in the development of draft advice. Information + Decision	IUU		Under the Work Programme of Year 7, the MAC committed to produce advice on an ad hoc basis when significant cases of IUU fishing products entering the EU market are known or when actions take place under the "carding system". In November 2022, the EU IUU Coalition published the report "Water-tight? Assessing the effectiveness of EU controls to prevent illegal seafood imports".
