Implementation of the TCA with UK




- ➤ The North Sea and Western Waters JDPs continues to operate with the Virtual Coordination Network, aiming to enhance a common situational awareness picture, and focus on risks related with the TCA with UK
- ➤ Main threats include compliance associated with licencing, access to resources, displacement of fishing effort and gear conflicts were identified
- The VCN was also a key channel of communication between the EC, Members States and EFCA concerning UK fisheries related issues, and a main forum to coordinate control activities.



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Support to regional Control Expert Groups



- ➤ EFCA provides support to foster a harmonised application of fisheries related regulations related to control and inspection
- ➤ In 2022, EFCA assisted with the implementation of the LO, in the areas of evaluation of compliance (pelagics NS and WW and demersal NS) and REM pilot projects







International dimension of the CFP



- In the international dimension of the CFP, EFCA assist the EU in the cooperation with third countries and Regional Fisheries Management Organisations (RFMOs) (namely, NAFO, NEAFC, ICCAT and GFCM).
- In the fight against IUU, EFCA assisted the European Commission with the analysis of catch certificates and processing statements and participate in missions on the spot.
- In the framework of several projects, as PESCAO, EFCA provides technical assistance and support as regards fisheries control to several Third Countries.



Who does what



Member States are responsible for control of:

- Responsible for activities in their waters/territories
- Vessels flying their flag
- Their nationals

European Commission:

- Formulates policy (CFP) to be adopted by the legislator and verifies its implementation by MS

EFCA:

- Coordinates and assists Member States and the European Commission







Assistance to the Commission (1)

- Communication with the Commission, MS, non-EU countries and international organizations, if appropriate, regarding:
 - refusals of authorisation of landing or transhipment of non-EU country vessels
 - information relevant for the management of the EU IUU vessels list
 - transmission of sightings information
- Preparation of, and participation to evaluation missions to non-EU countries upon request of the Commission
- Analysis of MS Biennial Reports on the application of IUU Regulation (Article 55(1)).






Assistance to MS: Training and IUU Regulation

EFCA IUU Exchange Programme

- ❖Idea presented in the EFCA Plenary meeting 2018; further elaborated and ToR adopted by the IUU SG in Dec 2019
- ❖Pilot Project launched according to the feedback received, participating MS: ES – DK – NL – DE
- ❖2 exchange events held in Dec 2019 and and Jan 2020 then suspended due to the pandemic
- Continued in 2023:






Cooperation with EMSA in the frame of the surveillance system "IMS" including Copernicus satellite images (Sentinel 1 and Sentinel 2).



Background to the Weighing project

- Follows from the Commission CR implementation reports in 2017 and 2021
- They point to significant differences in the quality and approaches taken by Member States for establishing SPs, CPs and CCPs, and associated procedures.
- Lack of standardised methodologies and sampling plans across EU Member States.
- Lack of statistical basis to ensure the representativeness of sample sizes for weighing
- The methodologies required to develop these plans in the Implementing Regulation were also identified as a potential problem due to a lack of clarity in how they should be applied



EFCA were the successful tender applicant for the project in 2021


Summary of expected results

- Overview of Member States weighing procedures and practices.
- Overview of methodologies set in the Implementing Regulation for drafting sampling plans, control plans, and common control programmes.
- Identify best practices for weighing and recording of catches.
- Advance on standardised methodologies for sample weighing and produce harmonized guidelines and methodologies to ensure accurate and efficient weighing and ensure control and inspection of the weighing provisions for each type of fisheries products.



EFCAs cooperative approach to the tasks

- Consultative approach via dedicated points of contact nominated by each MS
- Building on the existing good cooperation EFCA has with MS.
- Dedicated discussion and submission from MS on each aspect of the project
- Discussion with the MS on the challenges to the correct weighing of fishery products.
- Benefiting from the specific expertise in the MS on weighing, weighing systems, and their control.
- Visits to some facilities with MS authorities to observe weighing practices.
- Working with the MS input to propose guidance and best practice on sample weighing.

2022 to 2024

Phase 1

Development of the workplan and tentative timetable, including an outline of the methodologies for tasks listed and a list of Member States to be visited, the criteria and indicators for the evaluation of the methodologies set in the Implementing Regulation for drafting the SPs, CPs and CCP, are agreed with the Commission.

Phase 2

Task 1 – Description and analysis of weighing practices of fisheries products

Task 2 – Evaluation of existing sampling plans, control plans and common control programmes

Task 3 – Evaluation of the weighing methodologies set out in Chapter II, Title IV of the Implementing Regulation

Task 4—Issuing recommendations, identifying best practices and producing standardized and harmonized guidelines to ensure efficient and effective weighing, and control, enforcement and inspection of the weighing provisions for each type of fisheries products
