Information + Decision	Trade	Under the Work Programme, trade developments are a priority. In previous meetings, DG MARE representatives provided updates on the ongoing negotiations on market access for fisheries and aquaculture products to the EU. According to the information provided, Norway and Iceland seek a complete liberalisation of market access for fishery and aquaculture products, while the EU does not have a trade-related interest in the liberalisation. Information + Decision	Fisheries Control	In May 2023, provisional political agreement was reached between the European Parliament and the Council on the revision of the fisheries control system proposed by the European Commission. The new rules aim for improved monitoring and traceability of catches. In the past, the MAC held several exchanges about the revision and adopted advice on the topic. Consideration	Forced Labour	<p>In 2021, President von der Leyen announced that further EU legislative action was needed to tackle the use of forced labour in the value chains of companies operating in the single market. The legislative initiative aims to ban the placing on the EU market of products made wholly or in part by forced labour. The ban would cover both domestic and imported products. It would be combined with risk-based enforcement framework. On 19 September 2022, COM adopted the legislative proposal. At the 26 January 2023 meeting, members agreed on Terms of Reference for an external study on forced labour in the fisheries and aquaculture market. Information	China	<p>The European Parliament's PECH Committee is preparing an own-initiative report on "The implications of Chinese fishing operations on EU fisheries and the way forward". MEP Pierre Karleskind was appointed Rapporteur. Prior to that, the European Parliament commissioned a study reviewing China's mariculture and marine fisheries with emphasis on the operations of its Distant Water Fleets, which has been presented to the Executive Committee. On 13 December 2022, the MAC and the LDAC adopted joint advice on the activities of China's global distant water fleet.
