Information + Decision	Work Programme of Year 9	The operational year of the MAC corresponds to 1 October to 30 September. In line with the Rules of Procedure, the Executive Committee shall prepare the strategic plan and the budget for the next operational year. In line with the applicable financial rules, the draft must be submitted to DG MARE two months before the start of the new operational year. In line with the Rules of Procedure, the General Assembly shall approve the Work Programme and budget. Following the change to a lump-sum approach by DG MARE, 50% of the work programme's deliverables must be met to receive the full annual grant.	Presentation of the work programme and budget. Information + Decision	Work Programme of Year 8	The eight operational year concluded on 30 September 2024. Until up to two months after the end of the year, the Secretariat must submit a final report to the European Commission explaining the implementation of the work programme of the budget. In line with the Rules of Procedure, the General Assembly shall approve the annual report, including the financial statements.	Reporting on the implementation of the previous work programme. Information	Classification of members	<p>According to point c) of paragraph 3 of Article 4 of the Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2015/242, the General Assembly shall decide on the classification of the members under the categories of “sector organisations” or “other interest groups” using the criteria laid down in Annex I. Due to point d) of paragraph 1 of the Annex, organisations with more than 50% of the financing originating from industry undertakings shall be classified as part of the “sector organisations” college. These provisions result from an amendment, which entered into force in 2022. Prior to that, for several years, the MAC counted, in the “other interests groups” college, with a non-profit organisation with a least 50% of the funding originating from a certification scheme/label. Recently, another such organisation became a member, but has not yet been classified. The applicability of point d) is not fully clear, as the funding could be interpreted as originating from industry undertakings or as “own funding”.
