Information	Landing Obligation	As part of the ongoing evaluation of the Common Fisheries Policy, the European Commission commissioned an external study on the landing obligation. The study was published on 16 June 2025. While the fisheries management aspects of the landing obligation are outside of the area of competence of the MAC, there are market-related aspects, such as the outlets for unwanted catches. On 18 September 2024, the MAC adopted advice on the matter.
