Information	Traceability	On 9 February 2024, the amendments of the Fisheries Control Regulation entered into force. From January 2026, new rules on lots and digital traceability rules for fresh and frozen products will be applicable. Following a feasibility study, traceability rules will be applicable to prepared and preserved products within five years. At the 1 December 2025, several members expressed doubts about the upcoming implementation of the new rules on traceability and marking of lots. Information	CATCH	<p>The revision of the Fisheries Control Regulation introduced a new IT tool for the submission of catch certificates. From 10 January 2026, EU importers will need to submit the catch certificates for the importation of fishery products in the EU market. The aim is to have a fully digitalised workflow that facilitates exchange of data, information and documents, simplifying and speeding up administrative procedures.
